The NE Atlantic Blue Whiting FIP is the foundation of NAPA's work to drive sustainability into the management of the blue whiting stock. The FIP was granted an extension in October 2024 for a further two years. Under the extension, there is no departure from the original intention to design this FIP as a "policy FIP", however there is greater focus on delivering more efficient, effective, and impactful actions building on the solid progress that NAPA has made over the last three years, irrespective of whether that progress has been reflected at Coastal State level. In parallel to this, NAPA has also recently secured an extension to the mackerel and Atlanto-Scandian herring FIP.
